

Start the day with a hearty breakfast of made-from-scratch biscuits, gravy, house-made jams and jellies and fresh squeezed juices from Maple Street Biscuit Company. Try one of their unique creations like the Squawking Goat biscuit sandwich with fried chicken breast. a fried goat cheese medallion and house-made pepper jelly. These tasty eats will give you all the energy you need to start your exploration of Alpharetta.

For a relaxing morning activity, head to the North Point Parkway entrance of the Big Creek Greenway for a walk along part of the 8-mile paved walking and biking path. Then hop off the Greenway at Jekyll Brewing at Marconi Drive, where you can try one of their locally brewed beers like the Big Creek Kolsch, which is a perfect hybrid of an ale and lager for those who don't want to choose.

Once you've worked up an appetite, grab lunch at Barleygarden Kitchen & Craft Bar where you can dine with a great view of Avalon at the restaurant's rooftop bar.

Barleygarden offers a chef-driven menu of handmade sausages from Chef Matt Hutchins' butcher shop, The Spotted Trotter, as well as signature sandwiches, burgers, salads, all-day breakfast, and of course, an extensive beer, wine, and cocktail list. Be sure to check the restaurant's website for the beer menu of the day, as it changes constantly to ensure a wide variety of beers are on tap.

After lunch, take a few swings at Fairway Social. Alpharetta's newest entertainment venue offers The Back Nine with 9 customizable outdoor holes on synthetic turf. Fairway also features seven sports simulators offering virtual golfing on 80+ notable courses, baseball, football, soccer, lacrosse, hockey, cricket, and zombie dodgeball. Seating areas throughout the venue allow for fun, food, libations, and live music.

Dinner calls for refueling with authentic Cajun cuisine at Flatlands Bourbon & **Bayou**. Flatlands brings the flavors of Louisiana to Alpharetta with tasty dishes like the alligator bites, crawfish mac and cheese, and Catfish Pontchartrain. Wash it all down with a drink from their extensive beer, wine, and spirits menu, which includes bourbon selections from some of the most celebrated distillers in the country.

If you're not ready for your night to end, head to Currahee Brewing in Downtown Alpharetta for a nightcap of one of the brewery's craft beers. Currahee's favorite brews include Frankenstark, Garand IPA and Wayah Lager with seasonal and limited releases also offered.
